



HOUSEHOLD INCOME, EXPENDITURE AND CONSUMPTION DURING THE SECOND QUARTER OF 2011

Household Income

The average quarterly total income average per household member during the second quarter of 2011 is 940 Levs or by 3.8% more compared to the same quarter of 2010. The main part of this income (82.5%) is received from wages and salaries and pensions.


Wages and salaries continue to be the main source of household income. During the second quarter of 2011 they become 494 Levs per capita or by 8.4% more compared to the second quarter of 2010. The relative share of wages and salaries within the total income increases from 50.3% to 52.5% or by 2.2 percentage points more compared to the second quarter of 2010.

The second important source of household income is the income from pensions. The relative share of pensions within the total income decreases by 1.3 percentage point and becomes 30.0%. During the second quarter of 2011 the income from pensions is 282 Levs per capita.

The income from entrepreneurship increases during the second quarter of 2011 and it is 75 Levs per capita. The relative share within the total income increases slowly by 1.2 percentage point and it is 8.0%.

The weight of other social incomes during the second quarter of 2011 is relatively insignificant in the total household income. During the period this income increases by 8.3% and becomes 32 Levs per capita, the relative share increases imperceptibly by 0.1 percentage point and becomes 3.3%.

The relative share of monetary income into the total income during the second quarter of 2011 is similar in comparison with the same quarter of 2010 and it is 98.2%.



Household Expenditure

The total expenditure per household member during the second quarter of 2011 is 870 Levs and it increases by 8.2% in relation to the same quarter of 2010. Expenditure on food and housing (energy, fuel and water) has the greatest share in forming the total expenditure and constitute 49.5% of total expenditure.

The most significant part in the household budget is expenditure **on food and non-alcoholic beverages**. As absolute values it is 316 Levs average per household member during the second quarter of the year and increases by 1.9% in comparison with the same quarter last year. This relative share decreases by 2.2 percentage points and represents 36.4% in total expenditure.

The expenditure on **water, electricity, heating and furnishing** for the compared quarters decreases from 137 Levs to 135 Levs per capita; the relative share also decreases - by 1.5 percentage points and it is 15.6% in total expenditure.


The expenditure on **health** increases by 11.5% during the second quarter of 2011 in comparison with the second quarter of 2010 and becomes 51 Levs per capita, which represents 5.8% in the total expenditure and increases imperceptibly by 0.1 percentage point in comparison with the second quarter of 2010.

The expenditure on **transport and communication** increases by 6.0%, it is 97 Levs per capita as absolute values during the second quarter of 2011, the relative share decreases from 11.4% to 11.1%.

The expenditure on **alcoholic beverages and tobacco** increases by 2.2% and it is 39 Levs per capita during the second quarter of 2011. Its relative share of the total expenditure is 4.5% or 0.2 percentage point less compared to the second quarter of 2010.

The expenditure on **clothing and footwear** increases by 18.5% and is 27 Levs per capita during the second quarter of 2011. Compared to the second quarter of 2010 the relative share of this expenditure increased by 0.3 percentage points and reached 3.1% of the total expenditure in the same quarter of 2011.

Figure 2. Structure of the total household expenditure during the second quarter of 2010 and 2011






Household Consumption
