



EMPLOYEES UNDER LABOUR CONTRACT AND GROSS AVERAGE WAGES AND SALARIES, FIRST QUARTER OF 2015

According to the preliminary data of the National Statistical Institute (NSI) at the end of March 2015 the **number of employees** under labour contract increased by 26.5 thousand or 1.2% as compared to the end of December 2014 and reached 2.23 million. The highest increase was observed in economic activities: 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' - 9.0%, 'Information and communication' - 7.5% and 'Other services activities' - 7.2%. Decrease of employees was recorded in 'Administrative and support service activities' - 3.9% and 'Real estate activities' - 2.6%.

In the structure of employees by economic activities the biggest relative share of employees was in 'Manufacturing' - 22.3% and 'Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles' - 17.3%.

At the end of March 2015 as compared to March 2014 the number of employees under labour contract increased by 13.5 thousand or 0.6%. The highest increase in absolute figures was observed in economic activities 'Manufacturing' - 10.1 thousand, 'Information and communication' - 5.4 thousand and 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' - 2.6 thousand. In percentages the highest increase was in 'Information and communication' - 7.7% and 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' - by 3.8%. The highest decrease at the end of March 2015 as compared to March 2014 was registered in economic activity 'Administrative and support service activities' - by 5.5 thousand and in percentages - in 'Real estate activities' - by 6.9%.

The **average monthly wages and salaries** of the employees under labour contract in January was 856 BGN, in February - 839 BGN, and in March 2015 - 882 BGN.





Figure 1. Average wages and salaries by months





In the first quarter of 2015 in comparison with the fourth quarter of 2014 the average monthly wages and salaries increased by 1.4% getting 859 BGN. The highest increase in wages and salaries was reported in 'Information and communication' - 10.8% and 'Administrative and support service activities' - 8.1%.

Compared to the fourth quarter of 2014 the average monthly wages and salaries in the first quarter of 2015 rose by 7.9%. The highest growth rates were recorded in economic activities: 'Administrative and support service activities' - 16.1%, 'Professional, scientific and technical activities' - 13.7%, and 'Information and communication' - 12.4%.

The economic activities with the highest wages and salaries in the first quarter of 2015 were:

- 'Information and communication' 1 984 BGN
- 'Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply' 1 564 BGN
- 'Financial and insurance activities' 1 530 BGN.

The lowest wages and salaries were recorded in:

- 'Accommodation and food service activities' 586 BGN
- 'Other services activities' 612 BGN
- 'Administrative and support service activities' 643 BGN.

In comparison with a year earlier the average monthly wages and salaries in public sector grew by 4.5% while in private sector - by 9.4%.




Figure 3. Average monthly wages and salaries by kind of ownership





Methodological notes

The source of information is the Quarterly Survey on employees, hours worked, wages and salaries, and other expenditures paid by the employer. It is sample survey which main purpose is to make a study of the current state and dynamics of some main aspects of labour market. The sample used for the survey is a stratified random sample without replacement. Stratification criteria used include: economic activity (NACE rev.2), size of the enterprise (according to the number of employees) and regional breakdown (28 districts, NUTS3).
