

EMPLOYEES UNDER LABOUR CONTRACT AND GROSS AVERAGE WAGES AND SALARIES, THIRD QUARTER OF 2023

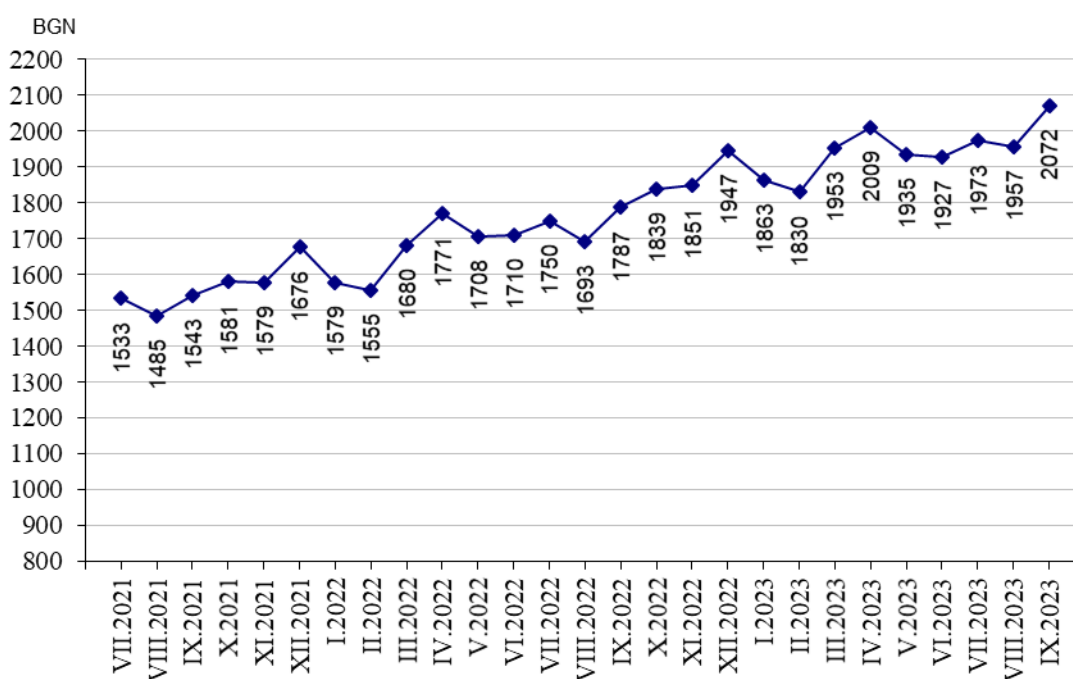
The **number of employees** under labour contract at the end of September 2023 decreased by 34.1 thousand, or 1.5%, compared to the end of June 2023 and reached 2.30 million according to the preliminary data of the National Statistical Institute (NSI). The highest decrease was observed in economic activities: ‘Accommodation and food service activities’ - by 15.8%, ‘Administrative and support service activities’ - by 2.7%, and ‘Manufacturing’ - by 1.4%. The highest increase of the number of employees by 1.1% was recorded in economic activity ‘Human health and social work activities’.

In the structure of employees by economic activities, the biggest relative share of employees was in ‘Manufacturing’ - 19.9%, and ‘Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles’ - 16.7%.

At the end of September 2023, compared to September 2022, the number of employees under labour contract increased by 22.1 thousand, or 1.0%. The highest increase in absolute figures was observed in economic activities ‘Human health and social work activities’ - 17.4 thousand, ‘Accommodation and food service activities’ - 6.8 thousand, and ‘Information and communication’ - 4.0 thousand, and the highest decrease was in ‘Manufacturing’ - 9.0 thousand, and in ‘Administrative and support service activities’ - 8.2 thousand. In percentages, the highest increase at the end of September 2023 compared to September 2022 was in economic activity ‘Human health and social work activities’ - by 10.4%, ‘Accommodation and food service activities’ - by 7.2%, and in ‘Information and communication’ - by 3.4%, as the highest decrease was reported in ‘Administrative and support service activities’ - by 6.7%, and in ‘Mining and quarrying’ - by 2.1%.

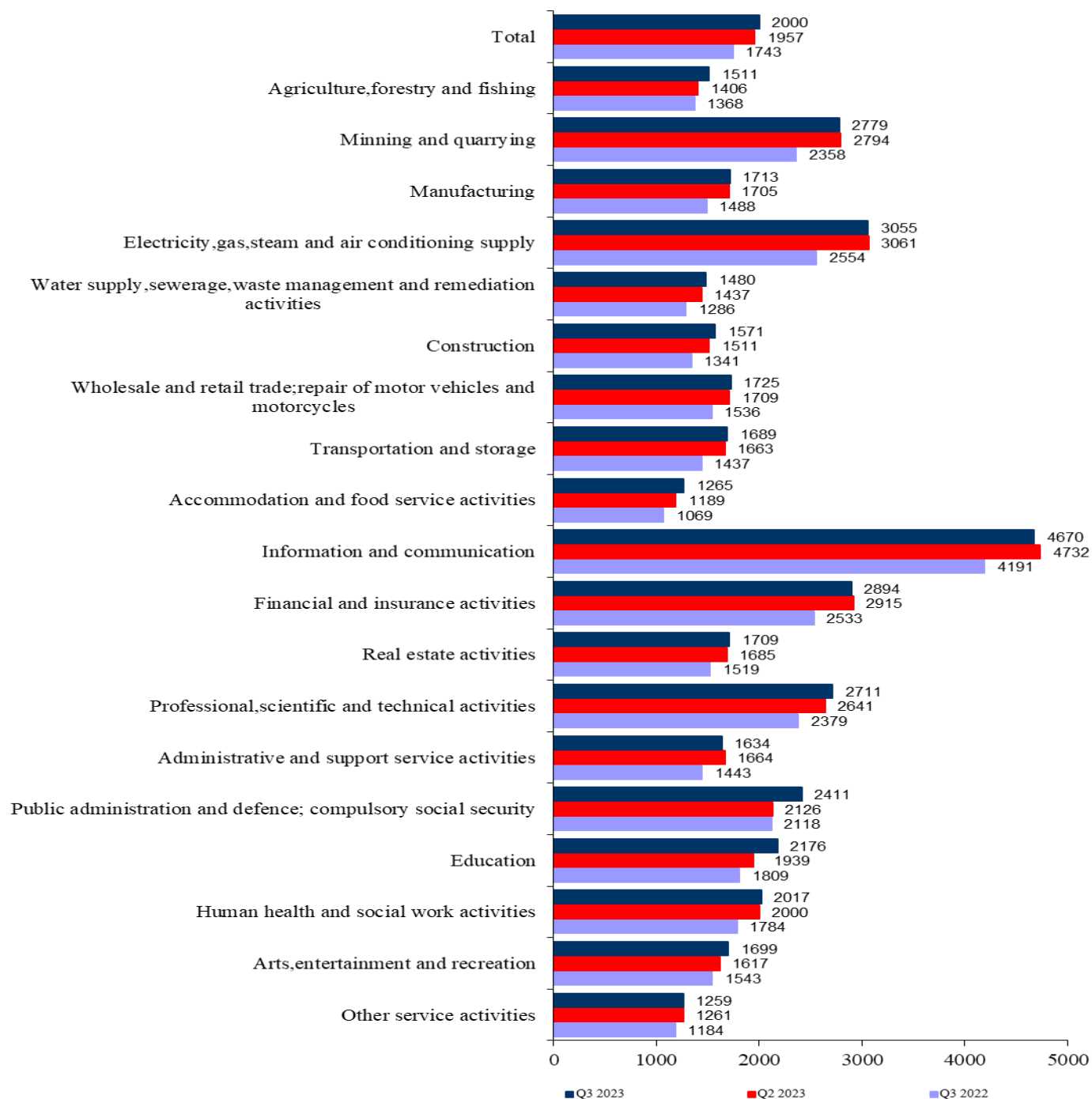
The **average monthly wages and salaries** of the employees under labour contract in July was 1973 BGN, in August - 1 957 BGN, and in September 2023 - 2 072 BGN.

In the third quarter of 2023, in comparison with the second quarter of 2023, the average monthly wages and salaries increased by 2.2% and reached 2 000 BGN. The highest increase in wages and salaries was reported in ‘Public administration and defence; compulsory social security’¹ - by 13.4%, ‘Education’¹ - by 12.2%, and in ‘Agriculture, forestry and fishing’ - by 7.5%.

¹ The third quarter data accumulate the effect of backdated pay increase of wages and salaries in ‘Education’ sector and some organizations from sector ‘Public administration and defence; compulsory social security’.

Compared to the third quarter of 2022, the average monthly wages and salaries in the third quarter of 2023 rose by 14.7%. The highest growth rates were recorded in economic activities: ‘Education’ - by 20.3%, in ‘Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply’ - by 19.6%, and in ‘Accommodation and food service activities’ - by 18.3%.

The economic activities with the highest wages and salaries in the third quarter of 2023 were:

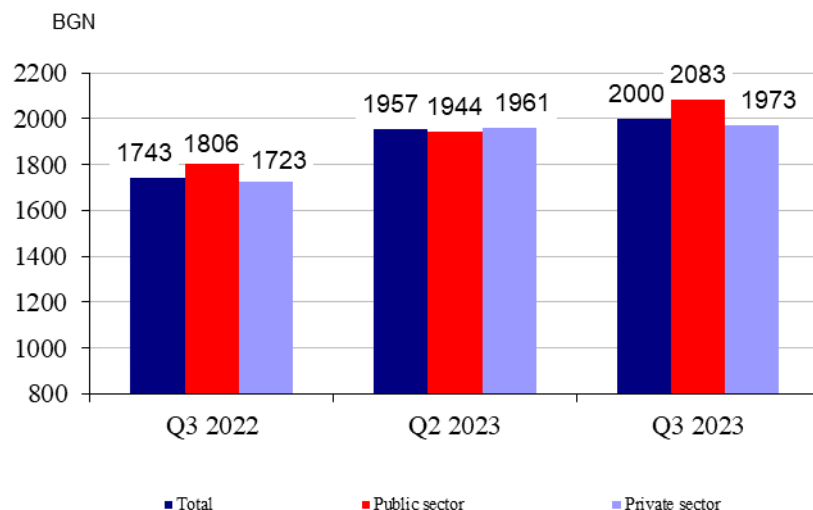
- ‘Information and communication’ - 4 670 BGN;
- ‘Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply’ - 3 055 BGN;
- ‘Financial and insurance activities’ - 2 894 BGN.

The lowest wages and salaries were recorded in:

- ‘Other service activities’ - 1 259 BGN;
- ‘Accommodation and food service activities’ - 1 265 BGN;
- ‘Water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities’ - 1 480 BGN.

In comparison with a year earlier, the average monthly wages and salaries in the public sector grew by 15.3%, while in the private sector - by 14.5%.

Methodological notes

The source of information is the Quarterly Survey on employees, hours worked, wages and salaries, and other expenditures paid by the employer. It is a sample survey which main purpose is to make a study of the current state and dynamics of some main aspects of labour market. The sample used for the survey is a stratified random sample without replacement. Stratification criteria used include: economic activity (NACE rev. 2), size of the enterprise (according to the number of employees) and regional breakdown (28 districts, NUTS3).
