





BULGARIA AND EU: GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, FIRST QUARTER OF 2020 (PRELIMINARY ESTIMATES)

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the first quarter of 2020 decreased by 3.2% in EU compared to the previous quarter by seasonally adjusted data. For the same period, GDP in Bulgaria increased by 0.3% (Table 1 of the Annex).

Compared to the previous quarter, in the first quarter of 2020 economic growth were recorded in Ireland - 1.2%, Romania and Bulgaria - by 0.3% each and Sweden - 0.1%. According to the seasonally adjusted figures, highest negative growth is observed in France and Italy - by 5.3% each, Slovakia and Spain - by 5.2% each, Slovenia - 4.5% and Portugal - 3.8%.



Compared to the same quarter of the previous year, seasonally adjusted data show a decrease of GDP in the EU by 2.6%. For the same period, GDP in Bulgaria increased by 2.4% (Table 1 of the Annex).

In the first quarter of 2020, compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the highest economic growth is observed in Ireland - 4.5%, Romania - 2.7%, Bulgaria and Lithuania - by 2.4% each, Hungary - 2.0% and Poland - 1.7%. According to the seasonally adjusted figures, highest negative growth is observed in Italy - 5.4%, France - 5.0%, Spain - 4.1% and Slovakia - 3.8%.
