



PRODUCER PRICE INDICES IN INDUSTRY¹ May 2012

Producer Price Indices on Domestic Market² 1.

Producer Price Index on Domestic Market in May 2012 decreased by 0.9% compared to the previous month. The domestic went down in the mining and quarrying industry by 1.2%, in the manufacturing by 1.1% and in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply by 0.6%.

In the manufacturing, the more significant prices decreases³ compared to the previous month were seen in the repair and installation of machinery and equipment by 0.9%, in the manufacture of of other nonmetallic mineral products and in the manufacture of electrical equipment by 0.2%.

Producer Price Index on Domestic Market in May 2012 grew by 4.3% compared to the same month of 2011. The domestic prices increased in the mining and quarrying industry by 2.5%, in the manufacturing by 3.4% and in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply by 6.7%.

In the manufacturing compared to the same month of 2011, the price increase was registered in the manufacture of chemical and chemical products by 6.5%, in the manufacture of tobacco products by 6.2%, in the manufacture of textiles by 5.9%. The prices reductions were seen in the manufacture of other nonmetallic mineral products by 2.0% and in the manufacture of electrical equipment by 1.3%.

¹Producer Price Indices measure the average change in the prices of industrial products, which are produced and sold by Bulgarian enterprises. They can be considered as an early measure of the current inflation process in the economy and also they can be used for international comparisons. Information for calculation of Producer Price Indices is received on the bases of monthly surveys on producer prices of industrial products, sold on domestic market and on industrial products sold on nondomestic market. Producer price surveys are based on constant sample of groups of products, and that sample is representative for total industrial production.


² Producer Price Indices on domestic market are calculated at constant base (2005) weighed with turnover structure on domestic market.

2. Total Producer Price Indices in Industry⁴

Total Producer Price Index in Industry in May 2012 decreased by 1.7% compared to the previous month. The lower prices were registered in the mining and quarrying industry by 0.1%, in the manufacturing by 2.1% and in the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply by 0.7%.

In the manufacturing, more significant prices decreases⁵ were seen in the manufacture of basic metals by 3.6%, in the repair and installation of machinery and equipment by 0.7% and in the manufacture of basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparations by 0.6%.

⁴ Total Producer Price Index is calculated from Producer Price Index on Domestic Market and Producer Price Index on Nondomestic Market weighted with the turnover structure on domestic and on non-domestic market to the total value of turnover in the base year 2005.

Total Producer Price Index in May 2012 grew by 3.2% comparing to the same month of 2011.

In the manufacturing, the prices rose by 1.9% as compared to May 2011. More significant prices increases were seen in the manufacture of textiles by 8.7%, in the manufacture of chemical and chemical products by 6.1%, in the manufacture of tobacco products and in the manufacture of rubber and plastic products by 5.3%, while the producer prices went down in the manufacture of basic metals by 9.9% and in the manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products by 1.3%.

Figure 2. Total Producer Price Indices in Industry (2005 = 100)


