Ninth: ELINT's only allegiance is to the **notion of collective** as a reference base for rebuilding CINT.

In the face of all these merits of ELINT, we expect that future index number theoreticians and experts in national accounting as well would not allow to be deprived of the blessings of the notion of collective, just like this proved impossible with the mathematicians as regards the enlightening blessings of the notion of set.
